COURSE DESCRIPTION

University of Vienna (2022-present, use of Moodle)

Master's in Gender Studies

RINGVORLESUNG

This course engages with some of the latest gender-related research done in and on the space that used to be socialist Yugoslavia. Throughout the academic year, we will be joined by a group of 11 activist scholars who explore topics ranging from Roma feminism, Islamophobia, homonationalism, queer-friendly psychotherapy, masculinity, trans and intersex activisms, international relations, racism, and lesbian sexuality. Class discussions centre around the challenges of producing gender-relevant knowledge about semiperipheral spaces in the wake of socialism.

QUEER POLITICS (both as guided reading and Individuelle Schwerpunktsetzung)

This course explores the developmental trajectory of the LGBTQ movement from its sweeping, revolutionary claims in the 1960s and 1970s to today's homonormativity and homonationalism. The course examines the contentious issues around identitarian sexual and gender politics and engages with analytical tools that are necessary for understanding the sphere of queer-related struggles for emancipation, justice, and equality. In this regard the course problematises and promotes academic-activist interactions.

• RESEARCH SEMINAR: CONFLICTS, TENSIONS, CONTRADICTIONS

In this course, students work in small groups (3-5) and are expected to complete an empirical, gender-related research project. Starting with a social tension, conflict, contradiction of their choice, students come up with a critical literature review, operationalise a research topic, specify a research question, choose the appropriate methodological techniques for collecting and analysing data, prepare a research proposal and a research report. Throughout the seminar all of these aspects of the research process are explored in detail.

• THEORIES OF GENDER

It looks like everyone has something to say about gender. This is because gender is – along with race and class – a major operator of power, it informs and shapes practically all of our social interactions. This course engages with various strands of feminist theory with the aim of understanding what is at stake in gender-related debates and why it is that they are often so polarising. Particular attention is paid to how gender hierarchies are intertwined with other regimes of oppression and discrimination. When exploring the ways

in which the categories of 'gender' and 'sexuality' have evolved over the last decades and gone beyond binary divisions, the course asks how different accounts of this evolution can help us make sense of our current political moment.

QUEER POLITICS

This course explores the developmental trajectory of the LGBTQ movement from its sweeping, revolutionary claims in the 1960s and 1970s to today's homonormativity and homonationalism. The course examines the contentious issues around identitarian sexual and gender politics and engages with analytical tools that are necessary for understanding the sphere of queer-related struggles for emancipation, justice, and equality. In this regard the course problematises and promotes academic-activist interactions.

Methodologies of Gender Research

This course engages with some of the major issues in the area of gender-related research. Students are expected to work in groups and complete a small, empirical, gender-related research project by the end of the seminar. Starting with a social tension, conflict, contradiction of your choice, students come up with a critical literature review, operationalise a research topic, specify a research question, choose the appropriate methodological techniques for collecting and analysing data, prepare a research proposal and write a research report. Throughout the seminar will discuss all of these aspects of the research process.

University of Sarajevo (2022-2024)

European Regional Master's in Human Rights and Democracy in South East Europe

Social Movements in South East Europe

The course departs from the widely popular focus on elite-level politics in the post-Yugoslav space and familiarises students with the basic conceptual instruments for studying social movements/activist organising in the region. The course starts from the premise that 'social movements are systems of tension' (Melucci) and explores how social movement theories can help us navigate the sphere of activist engagement and make sense of its objectives, strategies, and contestations. Examples are drawn from the lecturer's own research on the history and politics of (post-)Yugoslav anti-war, leftist, feminist, LGBTQ, and anti-psychiatry movements.

University of Bologna (2016-2024)

Master's in East European and Eurasian Studies

Gender and Social Movements in South East Europe

This course provides students with a basic understanding of the relevance of gender in the socialist and post-socialist South East Europe. In the course the lecturer draws upon his own research in the Yugoslav region to examine the ways in which national belonging, state building/dissolution, and citizenship are gendered. The course pays particular attention to the concepts of patriarchy and intersectionality, encouraging students to reflect upon the strong patriarchal backlash that took place in the region towards the beginning of the 1990s as well as upon the consequences that this has had for the nature of activist engagement.

University of Amsterdam (2014-2016)

Master of Science in Sociology: Gender, Sexuality and Society

RAINBOW POLITICS: TOPICS IN LGBT ACTIVISM

This course engaged with some of the most salient issues in the field of LGBT activism and introduced analytical tools for understanding the sphere of LGBT-related struggles. We examined some of the major challenges posed by identitarian sexual politics and tried to see why it is that painful disagreements arise among people who we would expect to be united around similar political goals. We read and discussed about various facets of activist undertakings, fostering academic-activist interactions and exploring what these two modes of engaging with the social world could learn from each other. This course was taught for two consecutive years, six weeks with the total of 24 hours per semester (two two-hour meetings per week).

Master's Thesis Seminar

This is a standard MA course at the University of Amsterdam. The course prepares a group of supervisees for empirical research and MA thesis writing. During the course, students discuss and write a detailed thesis proposal which guides them in conducting empirical work and completing their theses. This course lasts 6 weeks (one two-hour meeting per week). I taught this course for two consecutive years (4 students in the first and 3 students in the second year of my stay at the University of Amsterdam. I also co-supervised 4 students who attended a thesis seminar given by another lecturer).
